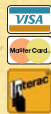

Ticket Purchases

RESERVATIONS are recommended and tickets may be purchased in advance by calling the Railway toll free at 1-800-242-9287 between 9:00 a.m. and 09:00 p.m. A customer service representative will assist you with your reservation and please be prepared to provide your Visa or Mastercard number and expiry date. You will receive a confirmation of your booking and payment via mail or email. The Ticket Office is open from 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. and reserved tickets may be picked up one day prior to or on the morning of your train departure (please have your booking confirmation). Please note that the Train pulls up to the Depot at approximately 7:30 a.m. for boarding and departs at 8:00 a.m., we suggest arriving prior to 7:30 a.m. if picking up your tickets on the morning of departure. If you do not purchase advance tickets, remaining seats may be purchased the day prior to or on the morning of departure and are subject to availability.



Changes & Cancellations

Cancellations are accepted up to 14 days prior to tour date. If received LESS than 14 days prior to tour date a 10% cancellation fee applies. Tour date changes will be accepted at no additional charge, subject to availability. If date change cannot be accommodated then cancellation policy takes precedence.

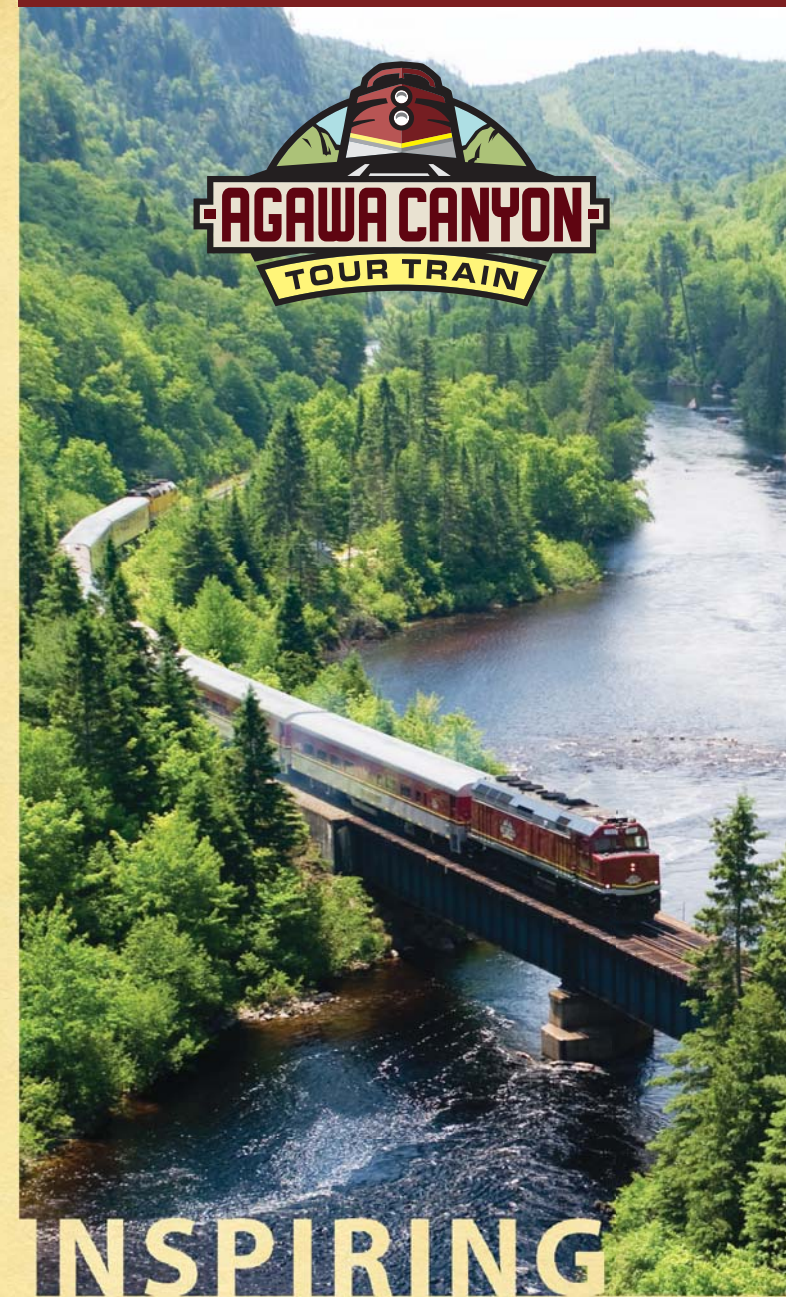

INSPIRING

A one-day rail excursion into the heart of the Canadian wilderness.

All Aboard!

Northern Ontario's rugged beauty often surprises visitors and an engaging way to experience these incredible landscapes is aboard the one-day Agawa Canyon Tour Train. Departing from the Railway's depot in downtown Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, this 114 mile excursion truly showcases the rugged scenery that's exclusive to the region.

As you settle into your comfortable coach, you'll feel the pace of life slow as thoughts of riding a train evoke a sense of simpler times, while raising expectations of the journey ahead. Shortly after rolling away from the depot, traces of city life will fade as the Northern Ontario wilderness unfolds outside the large tinted windows. Seemly unending mixed forests of the Canadian Shield open suddenly as the rails skirt the shores of remote lakes and rivers, cut through granite rock-cuts and cross towering trestles. You are experiencing the same rugged landscapes and majestic views that inspired members of the Group of Seven to first travel to the area in 1918. Renting a box car outfitted as a cabin from the Railway they were shunted to different sidings along the rail line to sketch and paint, creating some of Canada's most notable landscape art.

As the train winds its way through this one-of-a-kind landscape, a GPS triggered commentary weaves the story of region. Available in five languages including English throughout the coaches and in French, German, Japanese and Mandarin via wireless headsets, you will learn about upcoming points of interest as well as the some of the areas rich history with stories of the Ojibway, fur traders, explorers and entrepreneurs that opened up this vast wilderness. The beautiful scenery outside your window is further enhanced by the locomotive mounted cameras providing an engineer's 'eye-view' over flat screen monitors installed throughout the coaches.

Just when you thought you had experienced it all, the train will begin its descent into the canyon at Mile 102 and as the rail line hugs the top of the canyon wall you will travel down 500 feet over the next 10 miles to the floor of the Agawa Canyon, created more than 1.2 billion years ago by faulting and widened and reshaped by the last ice-age that retreated some 10,000 years ago.

As the train pulls to a stop at Mile 114, you will have an hour and half to experience the 'jewel' of the tour, Agawa Canyon Park. Enjoy scenic walks on gravelled trails leading to several waterfalls or experience the invigorating climb up over 300 stairs to the breathtaking Lookout, perched 250 feet above the canyon floor. For those looking for something a little more relaxing you can enjoy a peaceful lunch in the many picnic areas located throughout the park, or just pull up a bench and watch the Agawa River flow peacefully by.

Though well maintained, please remember this is a wilderness park setting and we recommend seasonal recreational clothing and footwear. There is also plenty to photograph during your excursion so be sure to pack your camera.

Fall Colour Season

Algoma Country is ablaze with colour during autumn and for decades the Canyon Tour has been a favourite way for fall 'leaf peepers' to experience some of the most spectacular fall colour in North America. Though peak colour varies each season, typically the last two weeks of September and the first week of October can offer the best colour and should be considered when planning your excursion. Please note that due to popularity, the Railway recommends booking your 'fall colour' tour early.

Dining Car Service

Dining on a train is a unique experience and full meal service is available in the dining car from time of boarding until approximately 4:00 p.m. and includes hot and cold breakfast and lunches, picnic box lunches, assorted hot and cold beverages as well a variety of alcoholic beverages including beer, wine, coolers and mixed drinks. Café coach service is also available offering snacks, light lunches and beverages. You may also bring your own food and snacks onboard but personal food and drinks are not permitted in the dining car.

Note: Consumption of personal alcohol is prohibited by law.
